2. School-Counseling Department Mission Statement:

The mission of Moniteau School District's School Counseling Department is to provide a comprehensive developmental program that ensures every student's mastery of academic, career, and personal/social development through a cooperative partnership with students, family, school, community and postsecondary institutions.

Individuals possess within themselves the power to control the quality, growth, and satisfaction in their lives. Our counselors fulfill a vital role in helping students meet their personal, social, educational, and career needs. Students are assisted in acquiring the skills, knowledge, and attitudes necessary to become effective students, responsible citizens, productive workers, and lifelong learners. Counselors use their expertise to provide counseling, instruction, consultation, prevention, and intervention services to support the school's academic mission, to enhance the learning process, and assist students in making informed positive choices fulfilling their personal potential.

The program's ultimate goal is for all students to graduate with the competencies necessary to make self-directed, realistic, and responsible decisions, and to be successful contributors to a rapidly changing global society.

The Moniteau School Counseling program is based on the following beliefs and principles:

- All students have dignity and worth.
- All students can learn, grow, and achieve.
- Each child is unique and has his/her own developmental needs that impact learning.
- The school counseling program supports the school's academic mission by promoting and enhancing the learning process for all students through an integration of academic, career, and personal/social development.
- Each student has certain educational responsibilities and rights.
- The school counseling program is comprehensive and systematically implemented.
- The school counseling program functions in collaboration with students, school staff, parents, guardians, and the community to ensure student success.
- The school counseling program is managed by state certified counselors.
- The Pennsylvania Standards for School Counseling Programs and the American School Counselor Association (ASCA) National Standards for Students shall set the standards for the school counseling program.
- Professional School Counselors shall uphold the ethical standards specified by the state of Pennsylvania and prescribed by the American School Counselor Association and the American Counseling Association.

3. Program Goals

a. <u>Personal/Social Counseling Goal</u>:

Both school counseling departments will raise awareness and provide resources for the on-going mental health needs of our students. Through a discussion with Administration, topics and questions are shared in order to guide the in-service training the school counseling department has throughout the 2022-25 school years. In the end, the department's goal is to increase the quality of support available to students throughout the district as well as the coordination of those supporting groups to offer more seamless transitions for students from one intervention to the next. Professional Development in Social/Emotional support has been included in our District Comprehensive Plan.

District Comprehensive Plan Goal:

By the year 2025 district staff members will undergo one hour of professional development per year regarding trauma informed care from a professional counseling agency.

b. Academic Counseling Goal:

Dassa McKinney:

The Dassa McKinney School Counseling Department will help students acquire necessary attitudes, knowledge, and skills to be effective lifelong learners. The Counseling Department will help develop an understanding of the relationship of academics, home, work, and community.

Moniteau Junior Senior High School:

The Counseling Department will update and incorporate academy designations for all students that will provide clear and achievable course pathways for all students in grades 9-12. Mathematics skills and overall improvement is a focus of our District Comprehensive Plan. Students will be placed in courses that are designed to support growth and build competency in grades 7-12.

District Comprehensive Plan Goal:

During the 2025 Spring PSSA testing window, students in grades K-8 will show a 5% increase in the overall achievement percentage for each grade level on Math PSSA scores when compared with similar scores for the 2022 PSSA Math test., and/or produce a 5% growth in individual test scores for 50% of the students who scored basic or below basic on the PSSA Math test in Spring 2022.

c. Career Counseling Goal:

Dassa McKinney:

The Dassa McKinney School Counseling Department will aid in providing a foundation for students to understand their interests, abilities and challenges. School counselors will provide prevention education, individual/small group, classroom career guidance lessons, and etc. Each grade level will be accompanied by a respective Specials teacher and will have career artifacts collected throughout the year. School Counselors will be conducting 6th grade career guidance lessons through a variety of avenues (ie: EVERFI, Google Applied Digital Skills, and etc.)

Moniteau Junior Senior High School:

The school counseling departments will update and incorporate both Career Cruising and PA Career Zone into the curriculum. This will be a phase-in approach. The district is continuously revising and overhauling the entire curriculum for students and reconsidering the manner in which students select classes. As part of this process we will be realigning all the scheduling lessons and resources to match with our new goals. All 8th grade students will be required to enroll in a 9 weeks Career Exploration Course. This course will allow each student to build an individual career action plan for grades 9-12. The district is also changing the manner of career counseling, moving more towards a multi-environmental career model including job shadowing, co-ops, Vo-Tech, work release, and college visits. Students will build career portfolios and graduation plans starting in their 8th grade year. These plans will include parent collaboration and community involvement. Parents and students will be given numerous opportunities to meet and review graduation requirements and career goals. Our community partners will be offered future options fairs, personal recruitment meetings for internships, and grade level meetings to discuss scholarship applications and financial aid options for post-secondary experiences.

District Comprehensive Plan Goal:

By the 2024-2025 school year, the district will see an increase in community engagement opportunities available to families, which will promote a stronger collaboration between all stakeholders to participate in the students' educational process.

4. Stakeholders

Students

• The students play a key role in communicating to us their needs, so we can properly align our program goals to meet those needs. Through a variety of developmentally appropriate activities and programs we will aid students in establishing lifelong personal and professional goals. The School Counseling Program will help provide students with a heightened self-awareness as well as a variety of skills including but not limited to: interpersonal communication, problem solving and goal setting.

Parents

• The parents are charged with the role of helping their children make responsible decisions through goal setting and realistic planning for the future. The school counseling program will make a variety of resources available to parents to aid in the process of directing and assisting their child in college, career of any type of post high school planning. Parents benefit from the insight counselors can offer through seeing their child daily in a different context. Counselors, students, and parents will meet to create and revise student graduation and career plans as needed.

Educators

• Educators will benefit from the school counseling program because the added support from the school counselors will help align the program to avoid unnecessary repetition of certain material while reinforcing other topics. Educators play a key role in the implementation of the program because they see the entire population of students on a regular basis and can simplify the process of disseminating the information to the student body. Educators can also work collaboratively with the school counselors to ensure that subject specific career information is being covered.

Business/Community

• The business and community will benefit from the collaborative sharing of resources that will occur between themselves and the school counselors. The business and community partners are integral to the program offering insight into the local economic climate and the jobs and positions available. The business and community partners also offer crucial information about the quality of the job applicants and employees they are getting from the high school and how the school counseling program can better prepare students for the needs of the community and businesses.

5. Role of the School Counselor:

School Counselors fill a variety of roles including leader, advocate, collaborator and instrument of systemic change. These roles are all vital to the school system because of the scope and influence a properly utilized School Counselor can have. At Moniteau High School, School Counseling looks a little different from other schools' programs based on the staffing, the resource allocation, and the location of the school district.

• Leaders

- Involved in district level leadership initiatives such as the Agricultural Certificate Program.
- Serve as District Testing Coordinators for district testing including, but not limited to: Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB), National Occupancy Competency Testing Institute (NOCTI), Advanced Placement (AP), Preliminary Schools Aptitude Test (PSATs), Pennsylvania System of School Assessment (PSSA), and Keystone Exams.
- Trained in current best practices such as Student Assistance Program (SAP), Run, Hide, Fight Intruder Response Training, Childline and Child Abuse Registry, and the Counseling Strategic Plan (Chapter 339).
- Provide direction and guidance on the delivery of college and career information.
- Make all aspects of college and career exploration available to all students.
- Function as the point of contact for teachers, parents, administrators, businesses, and postsecondary institutions with regard to the comprehensive school counseling plan.

Advocates

- Work to achieve the best possible academic options for students regardless of their post high school aspirations.
- Develop a variety of environments to ensure all students have a connection with a faculty or staff member.
- Provide counseling services that cater to academic, career, and social/emotional interests of students.
- Make post-high school college and career exploration methods available and accessible to all students.
- Foster relationships with outside service agencies designed to best meet the needs of our student population.

• Collaborators

- Fortify and renew our involvement with professional communities that best ensure personal and professional growth in our field.
- o Regularly reach out to stakeholders to promote healthy communication between all groups.
- o Participate in district and building level committees.

<u>Agents of Systemic Change</u>

- o Move towards a more cohesive comprehensive guidance plan from kindergarten through 12th grade.
- o Consider all available data to examine the direction and effectiveness of the guidance plan.
- o Focus on students whose needs are not currently being met through our program.

- o Make available any information that stresses the importance and impact of a well-staffed comprehensive guidance department in the execution of the guidance plan.



Graduation Pathways/ACT 158 Requirements

In an effort to remain consistent with the expectations defined by the Pennsylvania (PA) Department of Education, the graduation criteria specify that Moniteau students:

- 1. Will meet one of the five graduation pathways that are outlined below.
- 2. Earn 26 credits that are determined based on the student's career academy of study.
- 3. Will also be required to complete a culminating career portfolio consisting of a career plan and eighteen pieces of evidence by the end of the junior year.

EVERY STUDENT SUCCEEDS ACT (ESSA) and ACT 158 OF 2018 GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS: As a

requirement for graduation from the Moniteau School District, a student must achieve:

- 1. **Keystone Proficiency Pathway**: Scoring Proficient or Advanced on each Keystone Exam: Algebra 1, Literature, and Biology.
- 2. <u>Keystone Composite Pathway</u>: Earning a satisfactory composite score on the Algebra 1, Literature, and Biology Keystone Exams (while achieving at least a proficient score on at least one of the three exams and no less than a basic score on the remaining two). The composite score for the three exams is currently 4452.
- 3. <u>Alternate Assessment Pathway</u>: Successful completion of the Keystone Class associated with the Exam (grade C or higher) and one of the following:
 - a. Attainment of an established score on the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT), Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test (PSAT), American College Test (ACT), or Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB);
 - b. GOLD Level on the ACT Workkeys Assessment;
 - c. Attainment of an established score on an Advanced Placement Program or an International Baccalaureate Diploma Program exam in and academic content area associated with each Keystone Exam on which the student did not achieve at least a proficient score;
 - d. Successful completion of a Dual Enrollment Course in the content area associated with each Keystone Exam in which the student did not achieve at least a proficient score;
 - e. Successful completion of a pre-apprenticeship program; or
 - f. Acceptance in an accredited 4-year non-profit institution of higher education and evidence of the ability to enroll in college-level coursework.

- 4. Evidence Based Pathway: Successful completion of the Keystone Class associated with the Exam (grade C or higher) and demonstration of three pieces of evidence consistent with the student's goals and career plans, including
 - a. One of the following:
 - i. Attainment of an established score on the ACT Workkeys assessment, a SAT subject test, an Advanced Placement Program Exam, or an International Baccalaureate Diploma Program Exam;
 - ii. Acceptance to an accredited nonprofit institution of higher education other than a 4-year institution and evidence of the ability to enroll in college-level coursework;
 - iii. Attainment of and industry-recognized credential; or
 - iv. Successful completion of a Dual Enrollment or Post-Secondary Course; and
 - b. Two additional pieces of evidence, including one or more of the options listed above, or: Satisfactory completion of a service learning project; attainment of a score of proficient or advanced on a Keystone Exam; a letter guaranteeing full-time employment; a certificate of successful completion of an internship or Cooperative Education Program; or satisfactory compliance with the National Collegiate Athletic Association's (NCAA) core courses for college-bound student athletes with a minimum grade point average of 2.0.
- 5. <u>CTE Pathway</u>: For Career and Technical Education (CTE) concentrators, Successful completion of the Keystone Class associated with the Exam (grade C or higher) and attainment of an industry-based competency certification related to the CTE program of study or demonstration of a high likelihood of success on an approved industry-based competency assessment (Pre-NOCTI/NOCTI) or readiness for continued meaningful engagement in the CTE program of study.
